TARANTO CETACEANS' EDUCATION CENTRE KETOS





Located in one of the most prestigious eighteenth-century buildings - Palazzo Amati, KETOS deals with the promotion of the sea and cetaceans, through training, educational, scientific research and environmental communication activities. The establishment of such a center will further improve the capacities of Jonian Dolphin Conservation, which, taking into account the professionalism and experience of the staff, will have a significant impact on the education of visitors.

Since the opening of the Center, many activities have been organized, starting from the visit of 14 science teachers on October 27th 2022, who recognized the importance of this place for the further education of their students.



For now approximately 1000 students and teachers are expected to visit Taranto Cetaceans' Education Centre, and bearing in mind the great interest, an increase in the number of visitors is expected in the following period. The first school visit was organized on Thursday 26th January 2023, during which students, thanks to the experienced staff, had the opportunity to find out more about cetaceans through many activities by using the equipment which Centre owns.

Through the BioTourS project, IEC Tehnopolis created the BioTourS Dolphin Center, within which an educational exhibition about cetaceans was presented at the premises of the Natural History Museum of Montenegro. The ceremonial opening held on December 26th 2022. In the future, the Center will be a focal point for various exhibitions and interactive presentations aimed at increasing awareness of biodiversity and cetacean conservation.

BioTours Dolphin Center offers various contents that attract a large number of visitors of different ages every day, so that all those interested have the opportunity to learn more about the characteristics of cetaceans through the exhibition itself, but also through the high-tech equipment. Visitors are especially amused by VR headset thanks to which they can see what life under the sea looks like from a different perspective in a modern and innovative way.



The opening of the Center caused great interest, as evidenced by the large number of visitors in the previous period. Different school and preschool institutions from Montenegro organize visits of students to the exhibition, thereby highlighting the importance of the Center for their further education.
